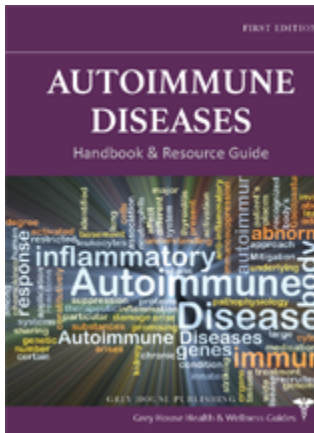

Four new titles were added to the Student Core Collection in March 2026. There are now 787 titles in the Student Core collection. There were no updated or retired titles this month.

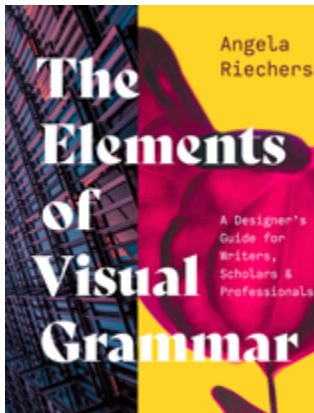

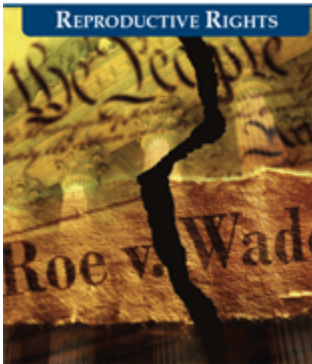
