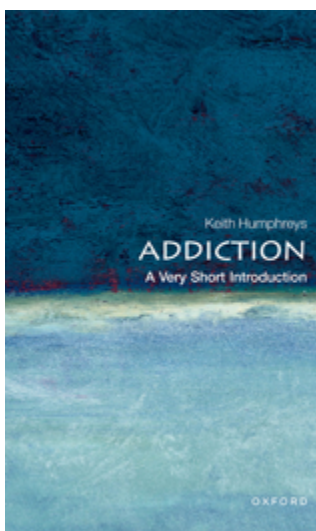


## May 2026 Content Update Academic Core

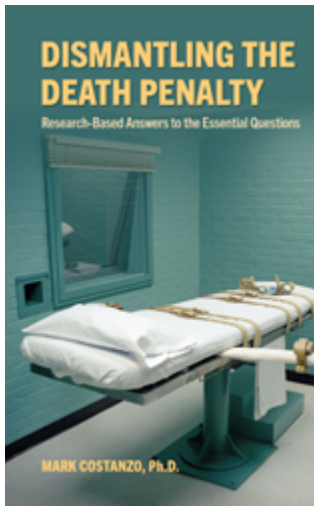

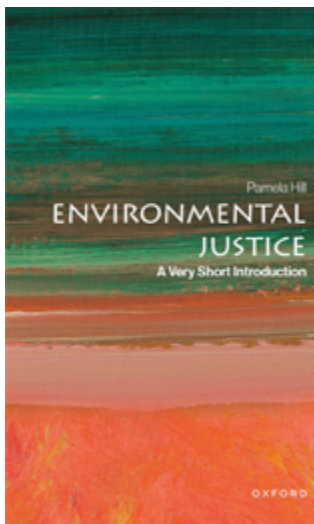

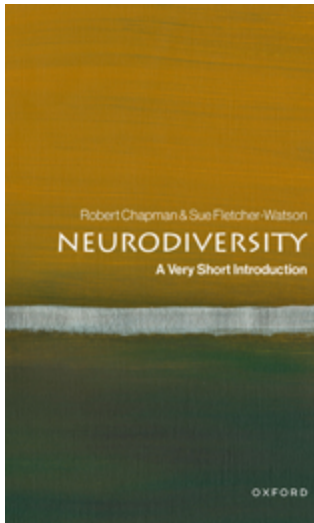
This edited volume examines the ways in which rapidly changing technologies and patterns of media use influence, and are influenced by, our emotional experiences.

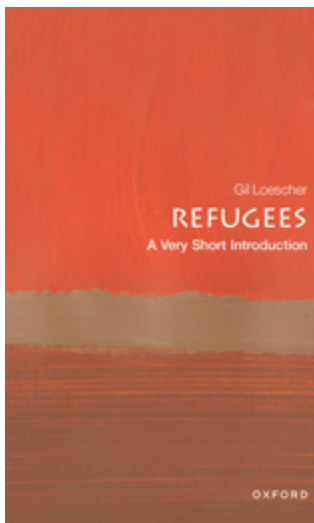

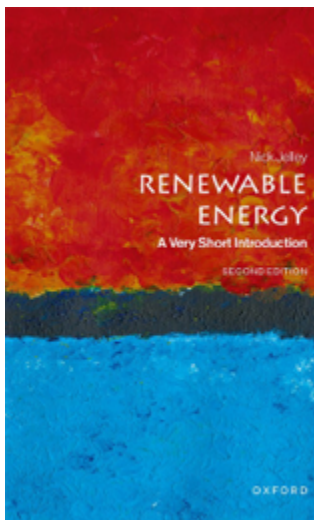
